Management Fee

NOTE 4: CONCENTRATION OF CREDIT RISK

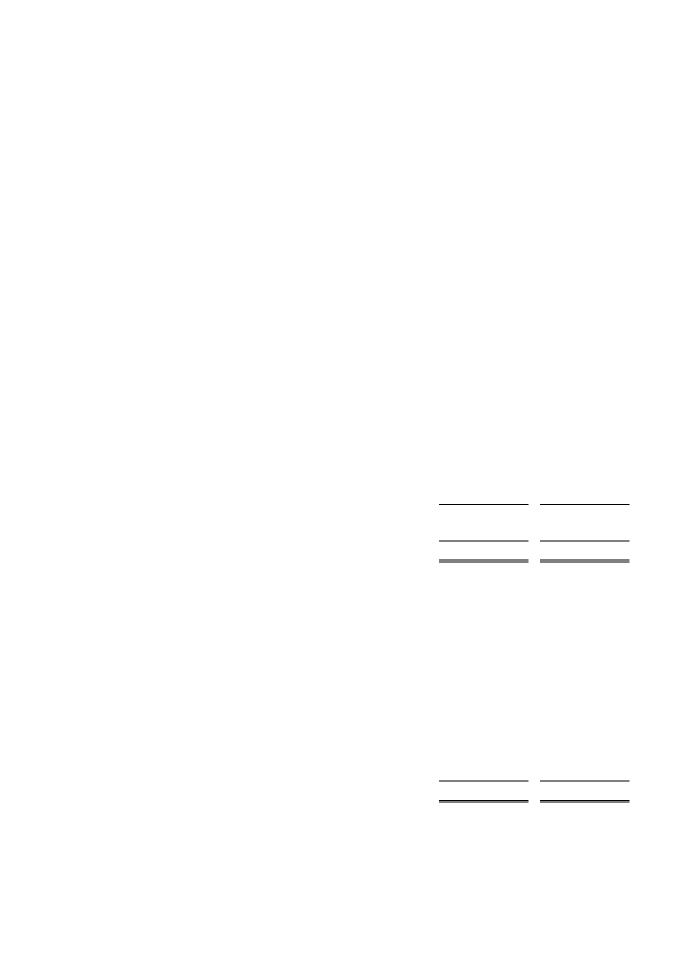
The Foundation manages deposit concentration by splacing cash and money market accounts, with financial institutions believed by us the creditworthy. At times, amounts on deposit may exceed insured limits or include uninsured in meetits in money market mutual funds. To date, the Foundation has not experienced losses in atthese accounts. Credit risk associated with accounts receivable and promises give is considered to be limited due to high historical collection rates and because substantial rions of the outstanding amounts are due organizations supportive of our mission. In viestits are made by diversified investment managers whose performance is monitored by Fithence Committee of the oard of Directors. Although the fair values of investments are subject fluctuation on a year-to-year basis, the Finance Committee believes that the investing entities and guidelines enprudent for the long-term welfare of the organizations.

Deposits

Custodial credit risk is the risk that in the ent of a bank failure, the Foundation's deposits may not be returned to it. The Foundation occasionally has a need to maintain cash balances in excess of \$250,000, the amount insured by the Federaphosit Insurance Corporation (FDIC). The Foundation's deposits in excess of the FDIC assuring. The collateral is held by the pledging bank's trust department, not in the Foundation's name.

Investments

NOTE 11: ASSETS HELD FOR SALE

The Foundation accepts boats and marine equipment to support the College's School of Sailing and Seamanship (the School). Gifts made to Foundation support 30% of the School's budget. Boats and marine equipment not used in the parm are held for sale. As of June 30, 2019 and 2018, the carrying value is \$11,750 and \$1,850, respectively.

The boats and equipment are recorded at fair market value at the date of donation. Because the items in inventory are typically peld for a very short time, this carrying value is not adjusted. Management has chosen to organize any change in value with realized due to economic uncertainties.
